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INTRODUCTION

The Council on American-Islamic Relations (CAIR), the nation's largest Muslim civil rights and advocacy organization, presents our CAIR 2024 General Election Congressional Scorecard. This resource aims to educate Muslim community members and allies as they prepare to vote in the upcoming general elections in November 2024.

The 2024 election cycle offers the American Muslim community a significant opportunity to enhance its political capacity and presence. Concentrations of Muslim voters in key swing states such as Arizona, Florida, Georgia, Michigan, Minnesota, Nevada, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia, and across the nation have the potential to influence which political party controls the U.S. House of Representatives, the U.S. Senate, the presidency, and the outcomes of other local, county, and state elections.

Key Description/Legend: CAIR's congressional scorecard evaluates the voting performance of representatives from the U.S. Congress up for re-election in the 2024 general election. Each legislator's votes have been assessed positively with green font (e.g., **Y, N, Cosponsor**) or negatively with red font (e.g., **Y, N, Cosponsor**) based on their alignment with civil rights and social justice priorities identified by CAIR. The criteria for each topic are grounded in legislation introduced and voted upon in the 118th U.S. Congress (2023-2024).

Note: Members of Congress who do not co-sponsor legislation or endorse letters supported by CAIR will not receive negative ratings. This is because not every Congressional office may have had equal opportunities to co-sponsor legislation or circulate letters supported by CAIR. Given the extensive volume

of legislation introduced in Congress, elected officials highlighted in this scorecard should not be judged solely by these criteria.

This scorecard serves as a general profile to aid voters in understanding the attitudes of elected officials towards key issues. A member of Congress' lack of co-sponsorship or support for a congressional letter does not necessarily indicate their stance on a given issue. CAIR does not assert the favorability of one candidate over another. Therefore, we urge readers of this guide to conduct further research into the actions of their local representatives before supporting any candidate.

2023-2024 LEGISLATION/BILLS/RESOLUTIONS

Bill Number: S. RES. 534 / H. RES. 989

Legislation Title: A resolution expressing support for the recognition of January as “Muslim-American Heritage Month” and celebrating the heritage and culture of Muslim Americans in the United States

Sponsors: Sen. Cory A. Booker [D-NJ], Rep. Andre Carson [D-IN]

Status of the Bill: Read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary on 01/25/2024.

Description: This resolution expresses support for the recognition of January as “Muslim-American Heritage Month” and celebrates the heritage and culture of Muslim Americans in the United States. It acknowledges the significant role that Muslim Americans have played and continue to play in shaping the cultural, economic, political, and scientific landscape of the United States. The initiative highlights the achievements and contributions of Muslim Americans across various fields, including education, science, technology, literature, arts, sports, business, and public service.

Bill Number: S.Res.504

Legislation Title: A resolution requesting information on Israel’s human rights practices under section 502B(c) of the Foreign Assistance Act of 1961

Sponsors: Sen. Bernard Sanders [I-VT]

Status of the Bill: Motion to table the motion agreed to in Senate by vote on 1/16/2024.

Description: This resolution calls for detailed information on Israel’s human rights practices in response to Israel’s war on Gaza. It highlights the significant casualties and destruction resulting from the conflict, particularly in Gaza, where densely populated areas have been targeted. The resolution emphasizes the involvement of United States-supplied munitions in Israel’s war on Gaza and calls for accountability to ensure these weapons are not used in violation of human rights. Additionally, it stresses the need for transparency and re-evaluation of U.S. security assistance to Israel.

Bill Number: H.R.666

Legislation Title: Access to Counsel Act

Status of the Bill: Read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary on 2/9/2023.

Sponsor: Sen. Alex Padilla [D-CA]

Description: This bill provides protections for individuals undergoing secondary or deferred CBP inspections upon entry to the United States at the border. Covered individuals include U.S. nationals, lawful permanent residents, visa holders, returning asylees, and refugees. The Department of Homeland Security must ensure they have access to counsel and related parties during inspections, allowing them to advocate on the individual's behalf. Lawful permanent residents cannot abandon their status until they have had a chance to seek advice from counsel unless they voluntarily waive this right in writing.

Legislation Title: Afghan Adjustment Act

Sponsor: Sen. Amy Klobuchar [D-MN]

Status of the Bill: Read twice and referred to the Committee on the Judiciary on 07/13/2023.

Description: This bill aims to provide support for nationals of Afghanistan who supported the United States mission in Afghanistan, ensure adequate vetting for parolees from Afghanistan, facilitate adjustment of status for eligible individuals, and grant special immigrant status for at-risk Afghan allies and relatives of certain members of the Armed Forces, among other purposes.

Bill Number: H.R.1325

Legislative Title: Asylum Seeker Work Authorization Act of 2023

Sponsor: Rep. Chellie Pingree [D-ME-1]

Status of the Bill: Introduced and referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary on 03/01/2023.

Description: This legislation mandates that the Department of Homeland Security grant employment authorization to eligible asylum seekers. Currently, asylees do not automatically receive authorization to work but may obtain it through the Department of Justice. Under this bill, employment authorization remains valid until an applicant receives a final denial of their asylum application, including all administrative and judicial reviews. Furthermore, the bill reduces the waiting period for obtaining employment authorization to just 30 days (about 4 and a half weeks) from the date of filing the asylum application.

Bill Number: H.Res.786

Legislation Title: Calling for an immediate de-escalation and cease-fire in Israel's war on Gaza

Sponsor: Rep. Cori Bush [D-NJ]

Status of the Bill: Referred to the House Committee on Foreign Affairs on 10/25/2023.

Description: This resolution calls for an immediate de-escalation and cease-fire in Israel's war on Gaza. It also urges the U.S. President to facilitate de-escalation and a cease-fire and to send humanitarian assistance to Gaza. The resolution highlights the killing of civilians as a violation of international law and emphasizes the need to save lives. As of February 29, the Gaza Health Ministry reports that at least 30,000 Palestinians, including over 10,000 minors, have been killed, over 70,000 injured, and 10,000 are missing under rubble, totaling over 110,000 casualties since the war began.

Legislation Title: Censuring Representative Rashida Tlaib

Status of the Bill: Motion to reconsider laid on the table Agreed to without objection on 11/07/2023.

Description: The American Muslim community unequivocally opposes the hypocritical and racially charged censuring of Representative Rashida Tlaib. Her voice is vital in representing the concerns of millions of Americans deeply troubled by the support our government extends to Israel's war crimes against the Palestinian people. Members of Congress in the U.S. House of Representatives who orchestrated the suppression and censure of the lone Muslim Palestinian voice in Congress find themselves on the wrong side of history.

Bill Number: S. 1916 / H.R. 3985

Legislation Title: Combating International Islamophobia Act

Sponsors: Sen. Cory A. Booker [D-NJ], Rep. Ilhan Omar [D-MN]

Status of the Bill: Read twice and referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations on 06/08/2023.

Description: This bill aims to establish the Office to Monitor and Combat Islamophobia within the Department of State. The Office will be tasked with monitoring and combating acts of Islamophobia and Islamophobic incitement occurring in foreign countries. By creating this office, the bill seeks to provide a dedicated platform within the U.S. government to track and address incidents of discrimination, prejudice, and violence targeting Muslims worldwide. It signifies a recognition of the importance of combating Islamophobia as a form of discrimination and promoting tolerance and understanding across international borders.

Bill Number: H.R. 4639

Legislation Title: Fourth Amendment is Not for Sale Act

Sponsor: Rep. Warren Davidson [R-OH]

Status of the Bill: Committee Consideration and Mark-up Session Held on 07/19/2023.

Description: This act aims to amend section 702 of title 18, United States Code, to prevent law enforcement and intelligence agencies from obtaining subscriber or customer records in exchange for anything of value. It also addresses communications and records in the possession of intermediary internet service providers, among other purposes.

Bill Number: H.R.6126 / S.3168

Legislation Title: Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2024

Sponsors: Rep. Kay Granger [R-TX-12]; Sen. Roger Marshall [R-KS]

Status of the Bill: Cloture motion on the motion to proceed to the measure rendered moot in the Senate on 11/14/2023; Passed the House.

Description: This act proposes allocating \$14.3 billion in American taxpayer dollars to Israel during its genocidal war on Gaza. The Department of Defense (DOD) would receive funds to replace defense items provided to Israel and cover the costs of defense services. Additionally, the State Department would receive funding for diplomatic programs and foreign military financing. Furthermore, the bill grants the President more flexibility in transferring defense items and services from the DOD to Israel.

Legislation Title: Resolution Recognizing Islam as One of the Great Religions of the World

Sponsor: Rep. Al Green [D-TX-9]

Status of the Bill: Referred to the House Committee on Foreign Affairs on 07/28/2023.

Description: This resolution expresses support for members of the Islamic community and recognizes Islam as one of the world's great religions. It acknowledges the teachings of the Islamic faith, which promote peace, equality, and social justice. Additionally, it emphasizes the importance of governments focusing on equity, justice, and compassion.

Bill Number: H.Res.246

Legislation Title: Recognizing the commencement of Ramadan, the Muslim holy month of fasting and spiritual renewal, and commending Muslims in the United States and throughout the world for their faith

Sponsor: Rep. Andre Carson (D-IN)

Status of the Bill: Referred to the House Committee on Foreign Affairs on 03/23/2023.

Description: This resolution acknowledges the onset of Ramadan, the holy month of fasting and spiritual renewal for Muslims and expresses its deepest respect to Muslims in the United States and throughout the world on this significant occasion. The resolution also recognizes the contributions of American Muslims to charitable organizations that assist people from all faiths in the United States and around the world.

Bill Number: H.Res.414

Legislative Title: Recognizing that the United States has a moral and legal obligation to provide reparations for the enslavement of Africans and its lasting harm on the lives of millions of Black people in the United States

Sponsor: Rep. Cori Bush [D-MO]

Status of the Bill: Introduced and referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary on 05/17/2023.

Description: This resolution acknowledges the federal government's obligation to provide reparations and advocates for the passage and execution of the Commission to Study and Develop Reparation Proposals for African Americans Act.

Bill Number: H.Res.76

Legislation Title: Removing a certain Member from a certain standing committee of the House

Sponsor: Rep. Max L. Miller [R-OH-7]

Status of the Bill: On agreeing to the resolution, Agreed to by the Yeas and Nays: 218 - 211, 1 Present (Roll no. 105) on 02/02/2023. Passed in the House.

Description: The resolution removed Representative Ilhan Omar of Minnesota from the Committee on Foreign Affairs. Two hundred and eighteen House Republican members, under the direction of then-House Speaker Kevin McCarthy, voted to oust Rep. Omar from her position on the committee. CAIR viewed the vote as a baseless and Islamophobic attack on Ilhan Omar and the broader American Muslim community, infringing on our right to engage in the political process and our dedication to speaking up for all victims of injustice, including the Palestinian people.

Legislative Title: Renewing Immigration Provisions of the Immigration Act of 1929

Sponsor: Rep. Zoe Lofgren [D-CA]

Status of the Bill: Introduced and Referred to the House Committee on the Judiciary on 03/09/2023.

Description: This bill broadens the scope of a program allowing the Department of Homeland Security to grant lawful permanent resident status to certain long-term residents of the United States, including individuals present in the country without legal authorization. Also known as the “Registry Bill,” this legislation proposes a practical solution for those already in the U.S. without immigration status and those with only temporary protections like TPS and DACA. The program is currently limited to eligible non-U.S. nationals who entered the United States before January 1, 1972. The proposed legislation eliminates this entry cutoff date, extending eligibility to individuals who have resided in the United States for at least seven years.

Legislation Title: U.S. House Resolutions Recognizing the Commencement of Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha

Sponsor: Rep. Andre Carson [D-IN]

Status of the Bill: Referred to the House Committee on Foreign Affairs on 06/27/2023.

Description: The resolution recognizes the Muslim holy month of Ramadan, emphasizing its significance as a period of fasting and spiritual renewal for Muslims worldwide. It extends best wishes to Muslims in the United States and globally for a joyous observance of Eid al-Fitr, marking the end of Ramadan. The resolution highlights the practices of fasting, worship, charity, and reflection on the Holy Quran during Eid al-Fitr. Additionally, it celebrates the diverse contributions of American Muslims to society and expresses solidarity with the Muslim community, recognizing their cultural and religious heritage. The resolution aims to promote understanding and respect for the Islamic faith while honoring the traditions and observances of Ramadan and Eid al-Fitr.

Bill Number: H.R.8034

Legislative Title: Israel Security Supplemental Appropriations Act, 2024

Sponsor: Cole, Tom [R-OK-4]

Status of the Bill: Passed House and Senate; President signed as a part of a \$ 95 billion foreign aid package.

Description: **This act proposes allocating** unconditional **\$17 billion in American taxpayer dollars to Israel during its genocidal war on Gaza.** Included in the Israel aid package is \$4.4 billion to replenish defense articles sent to Israel from DOD stocks, \$4 billion for the Iron Dome and David's Sling defense systems, \$1.2 billion to procure the Iron Beam defense system, \$2.4 billion for U.S. Central Command operations, further embroiling our military in Israel's ever-growing regional conflict. The package also has a provision continuing a prohibition on any U.S. funds being allocated to the UN Relief and Works Agency (UNRWA), which provides aid to Palestinians. Also, this new aid package would offer \$9.2 billion in humanitarian assistance, including emergency food and shelter.

Legislation Title: To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to terminate the tax-exempt status of terrorist-supporting organizations.

Sponsor: Kustoff, David [Rep.-R-TN-8], Cornyn, John [Sen.-R-TX]

Status of the Bill: Passed House and received in the Senate 4/16/24.

Description: This bill grants broad new powers to the Department of Treasury to terminate the tax-exempt status of nonprofits based on subjective claims of advocacy groups supporting terrorism.

Bill Number: H.R.7921 / S.4091

Legislative Title: Countering Antisemitism Act

Sponsor: Rep. Manning, Kathy E. [D-NC-6]; Sen. Rosen, Jacky [D-NV]

Status of the Bill: Introduced in the House and Senate on 4/10/24.

Description: The bill would require the state and federal interagency task force be stood up to combat antisemitism, using this expansive definition designed to silence Palestinian human rights activists, which could increase state discrimination and target Arab Americans and pro-Palestine supporters for speaking out against Israel's genocide in Gaza or occupation and apartheid state policies. The bill specifically aims to adopt the IHRA definition of expansive and misleading definition of antisemitism. The IHRA definition hinders legitimate free speech regarding Israel's human rights violations.

Legislation Title: Antisemitism Awareness Act

Sponsor: Rep. Lawler, Michael [R-NY-17]; Sen. Scott, Tim [R-SC]

Status of the Bill: Passed House on 5/02/2024.

Description: The bill attempts to suppress and criminalize First Amendment-protected political speech in American schools by also requiring the U.S. Department of Education to adopt the IHRA's misleading definition of antisemitism. If passed, this bill will freeze the free speech of all American students on campus.

LETTERS SENT TO THE ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER DEPARTMENTS

Letter Urging Protection of Innocent Civilian Lives

Key Sponsors: Rep. Jan Schakowsky (IL-09), Rep. Mark Pocan (WI-02), Rep. Pramila Jayapal (WA-07), and Rep. James P. McGovern (MA-02)

About: An open letter to President Joseph R. Biden and Secretary of State Antony J. Blinken, expressing deep concern about the humanitarian situation in Gaza amidst Israel’s war on Gaza. The letter urges adherence to international humanitarian law, protection of innocent civilians, and the establishment of a humanitarian corridor. Additionally, the letter emphasizes the need for peace in the region and offers assistance to the administration.

The letter makes the following requests:

- Communicate that Israel’s war on Gaza must be carried out according to international law and take all due measures to limit harm to innocent civilians.
- Work to quickly restore the delivery of food, water, fuel, electricity, and other life-saving necessities to Gaza to ensure that innocent civilians have the basics needed for survival.
- Collaborate with regional partners to establish a humanitarian corridor to enable the delivery of such life-saving necessities

and to allow Palestinian civilians and foreign nationals, including U.S. citizens, to seek safe haven outside of Gaza.

- Publicly discourage any hate crimes and backlash against any American—including Jews and Muslims.
- Ensure that supplemental funding requests to Congress include humanitarian assistance for both Palestinians in Gaza and Israelis.

LETTERS SENT TO THE ADMINISTRATION AND OTHER DEPARTMENTS

Letter in Support of Ongoing U.S. Diplomacy to Free Hostages, Restore Mutual Ceasefire Agreement in Gaza

Key Sponsors: Sen. Jon Ossoff (D-GA) and Sen. Reverend Raphael Warnock (D-GA)

About: This letter expresses strong support for the diplomatic efforts of the U.S. Administration to secure the release of hostages and restore a mutual ceasefire in Gaza. It highlights the critical role of U.S. diplomacy in facilitating humanitarian aid, securing the release of hostages, and negotiating ceasefires. The letter underscores the urgent need for a diplomatic solution to prevent further humanitarian catastrophe and to ensure regional peace and security.

Background: *Israel's genocide in Gaza is atrocious, with a lack of humanitarian aid and limited supplies to treat the sick and injured. The Minister of Foreign Affairs and Expatriates, Riyad Al-Maliki, has referred to the situation as a "war of genocide" against the people in the Gaza Strip.*

As of February 28, 2024, more than 30,000 people have been killed in Gaza since the war began, over 70,300 have been injured, and thousands more are missing and presumed dead. More than 100 Palestinians were killed and 280 wounded as they gathered to receive humanitarian aid in Gaza City. An estimated

70% of the fatalities are women and children. About 7,000 more are reportedly missing, and most are likely dead.

Call for Oversight of Use of U.S.-Origin Weapons by Israel in War Against Gaza

Key Sponsors: Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-VT), Sen. Jeff Merkley (D-OR), Sen. Tim Kaine (D-VA), and Sen. Martin Heinrich (D-NM)

About: This letter to President Joseph R. Biden, dated December 5, 2023, expresses senatorial concern about the civilian harm caused by Israel's use of U.S. weapons in Gaza. They acknowledge the importance of civilian harm prevention in American foreign policy and emphasize that U.S. weapons should be used in a manner that protects civilian lives. The letter highlights Israel's war on Gaza and expresses concern about Israel's military response. The senators call for accountability and oversight measures and urge President Biden to take immediate action to prevent further civilian harm.

The letter to President Biden also includes a series of questions regarding the U.S. government's awareness and oversight of Israeli military actions in Gaza, particularly concerning civilian harm prevention. Questions touch on topics such as the IDF's policies on civilian protection, the U.S. government's role in providing training and guidance to Israel, and mechanisms for reporting and investigating civilian harm incidents. Additionally, inquiries are made about the types of munitions provided to Israel, their intended use, and the level of oversight and accountability

measures in place. The letter underscores the importance of transparency and accountability in U.S. foreign policy regarding arms transfers and military support to allies like Israel, especially in conflicts where civilian casualties are a concern.

Urge Banks To Stop Discriminating Against Muslims

Key Sponsors: Rep. Ilhan Omar (D-MN) and Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA)

About: In a letter, over a dozen lawmakers urged U.S. banking regulators to reassess policies that they believe discriminate against Muslim Americans and communities of color. The letter was sent to Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen and other banking officials. The lawmakers expressed concern over “countless U.S. individuals, businesses, and charities” who have been victims of discriminatory policies and practices that limit their access to financial services due to their religion or national origin. They highlighted that many Muslim, Arab, Middle Eastern, and South Asian Americans have been systematically cut off from financial services. The letter pointed out that American Muslims and individuals from countries impacted by U.S. sanctions face numerous challenges when operating a bank account or sending money abroad. These challenges, including having bank accounts shut down without warning and flagged payments to loved ones abroad, are seen as disproportionate and discriminatory. The lawmakers called for a reassessment of these policies to ensure fair and equal access to financial services for all communities.

Lawmakers Seek Information from Big Banks on Account Closure Practices that Discriminate Against Muslim Americans

Key Sponsors: Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), Sen. Bernie Sanders (D-VT), Rep. Ilhan Omar (D-MN), Rep. Rashida Tlaib (D-MI), and Rep. Ayanna Pressley (D-MA).

About: This letter seeks information on U.S. banks' practices and the steps they are taking to prevent discriminatory banking practices. The lawmakers are responding to reports that central banks may be disproportionately restricting or shutting down the accounts of Muslim Americans.

These “de-risking” practices, purportedly aimed at mitigating suspicious activity, result in terminating or restricting business relationships indiscriminately with broad categories of customers and appear to disproportionately impact Muslim Americans. The letter highlights that a quarter of the American Muslim population have faced hurdles while banking in the United States. These challenges include being denied opening a new personal account, having a personal account suspended or closed, and being denied payment sent or received via payment apps. The lawmakers have requested information from the banks regarding their account closure policies and the number of accounts closed in recent years. As mentioned above, the lawmakers have previously sent a letter to financial regulators requesting

information on their work to modernize financial crimes and sanctions compliance obligations to protect and promote equitable banking access.

Lawmakers Raise Concerns over Accuracy, Due Process, and Civil Rights Violations with Terrorism Watchlist

Key Sponsors: Sen. Elizabeth Warren (D-MA), Sen. Bernie Sanders (I-VT), Sen. Ron Wyden (D-OR), Sen. Peter Welch (D-VT), and Sen. Cory Booker (D-NJ), along with Rep. André Carson (D-IN), Rep. Katie Porter (D-CA), Rep. Ilhan Omar (D-MN), Rep. Judy Chu (D-CA), Rep. Rashida Tlaib (D-MI), Rep. Madeleine Dean (D-PA), Rep. Barbara Lee (D-CA), and Delegate Eleanor Holmes Norton (D-DC)

About: The lawmakers have written to various officials, including DHS Secretary Alejandro Mayorkas, Attorney General Merrick Garland, and others, regarding concerns surrounding the accuracy of the terrorist watchlist and the weaknesses in the redress process. They seek information about the status and standards of the Terrorist Screening Dataset (TSD), the redress process for seeking removal from the dataset, and any steps the agencies are taking to address anti-Muslim discrimination stemming from the watchlist system.

The lawmakers raise ongoing concerns about the reliability of the list and the extent to which due process and civil rights principles are adhered to when placing and retaining individuals on the list. They also expressed concern that the list discriminates against Muslims, who make up an estimated 98% of its entries.
